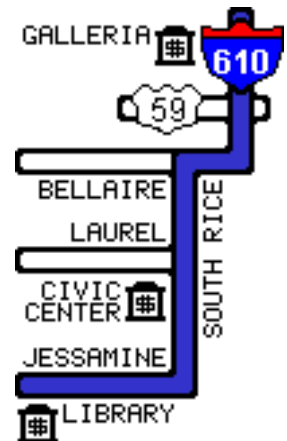

Editor's version of what happened to the Bellaire Coin Club in 2003.

January. Tim Conway noted that Ralph Ross of the Clements Coin Club needed a cash donation for a trip to the Florida United Numismatists show. Tim Conway and Ralph Ross reminded the club about the Clements Coin Show. Svetlana Loeffler made a donation to the children's auction. Michael Wolford won a door prize drawing and decided to donate it to the children's auction, after the meeting. Ralph Ross and Ed Stephens discussed the Florida United Numismatists show. The other known large shows are the improved Greater Houston Coin Club (GHCC)'s Money Show, and Long Beach. Tim Conway and members presented details of the National Week Show. Members discussed the current problems with the Bellaire Library's current closing schedule.

February. Carl Schwenker and Jeff Todd gave a report on the GHCC's Money Show. Jeff Todd stated one type of robbery scams. Carl Schwenker then showed some of the pictures taking during the show, including Don Kagan, as the world's oldest living pioneer, having his coins encased by the National Guaranty Corporation of America. Members discussed the first annual Clements Coin Show. Ron Miller noted how well, Michael Wolford had created the map to the show. The final board members are Tim Conway as President, Tom Cooper as Vice President, Ed Stephens as Secretary, Tom Bermel as Treasurer and Michael Wolford as Newsletter editor. Bellaire Police Officer Hollaway reminded about security at show and other security topics.

May. The members discussed the National Coin Week Show. Ron Miller noted that the snack bar had plenty volunteers. Tim Conway and Ginger Bing motioned to reduce the children's auction to one per day, the club voted yes. Ed Stephens noted that Gary Austin would be the Bellaire August Show chairperson. Tim Conway stated the Boy Scout's merit badge went successful. Brian Holland, Ron Miller and Randy Scofield wondered about insurance during the show. Michael Wolford noted that Frankie Mandola, past installation dinner location, looked closed. Tim Conway reminded about the TNA Convention in Fort Worth. Tom Bermel gave a partial summary of the National Coin Week Show. John Evans, Ed Smith suggested an installation dinner location. The club during past meeting discussed a club field day, one suggestion on the Vatican Exhibit. Michael Wolford with his family went to the this past weekend. Ken Loeffler noted that during the National Coin Week Show, someone needed first aid. The snack bar happened to have what was needed. Ken asked the club to get a first aid kit for the show in August.
