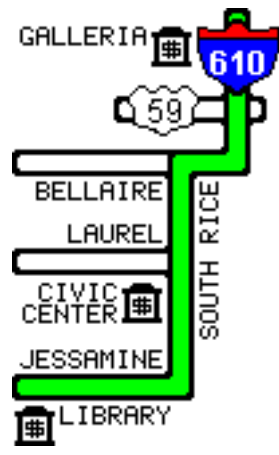

Editor's version of what happened to the Bellaire Coin Club in 2004.
