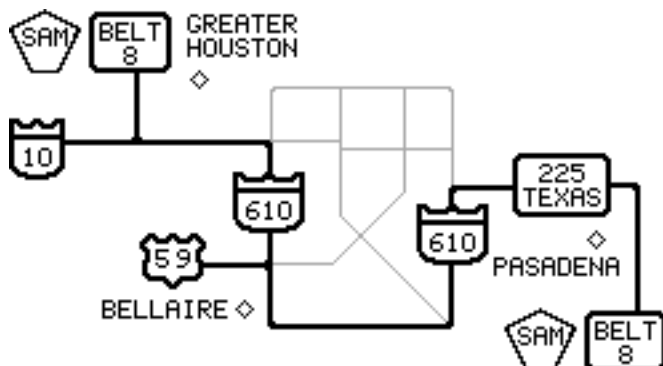

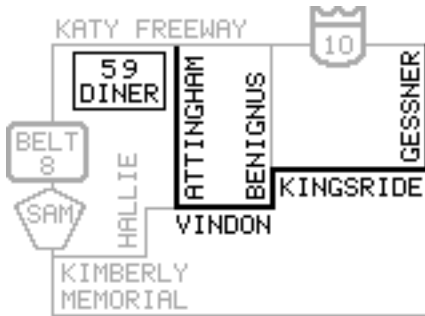

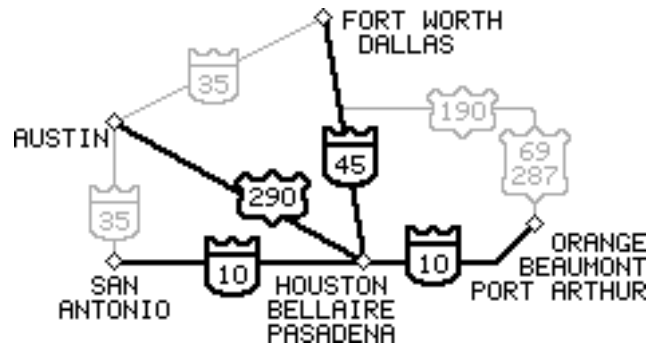

## **Editor's version of what happened to the Bellaire Coin Club in 2006, Page 1.**
