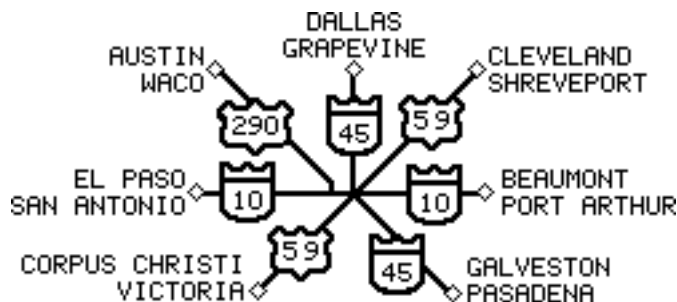

Editor's version of what happened to the Bellaire coin club in 2007, page 1.

January 2007. Richardo DeLeon and club members noted that almost every time the JMV entertainment offers a Houston coin show, people travel long distances without knowing about the cancellation. Ed Arrich listed members with confirmed items in the San Antonio Alamo Exhibits. Richard Laster reminded everybody about the Money Show. Brian Holland won the show and tell prize.

February 2007. Michael Wolford found and retyped an original copy of the constitution and bylaws of the Bellaire coin club. Michael found an article about Richardo DeLeon. Celica Soliz and Barbara Trout wondered about club shirts. Sebastian Frommhold won the show and tell prize. Ed Arrich wanted to be sent to the next ANA's Summer Seminar. Ed also requested that the Bellaire club become a bonded club. Ron Miller noted that in November 2006, there was a raffle to help a club member with ailing family. For some reason the club's tickets were not placed in the right place with the other tickets. Ron Miller provided raffle ticket refunds. Jim Rugh presented the program, collecting coins by chemical element.

The original dates were changed when another conference decided to use the entire convention center, including Greater Houston's confirmed area. Andrew Hollenberg and Justin Hollenberg won the show and tell prizes. Ed Stephens and club members discussed your Bellaire summer show, August 4-5. The auction gets plenty of dealer donations, but more members to donate; the club needs somebody to handle the general supplies, table covers, electricity and duct tape. Ken Benson will transport the Pasadena cases. Ed Stephens will set up the barbecue. Michael Wolford will work registration. Sebastian Frommhold has volunteered to help at registration. Tom Cooper, Rupert and Celica Soliz, Barbara and John Trout will help with the snack bar. Jim Bevill, Tim Conway, and Brian Holland will help with the children's auction. Brian Holland and Ed Stephens ask for help at the registration table before the auction, when there are two sign up lists, auction and visitor. Michael Wolford noted registration has never had a sign up sheet. Sebastian stated that Michael Greenspan has been on life support. Ed Stephens received a note from Jim Bevill, the TNA president, Jim announced that the TNA will schedule a Houston show in February. Gene McPherson presented the program, Roman Republic coins.

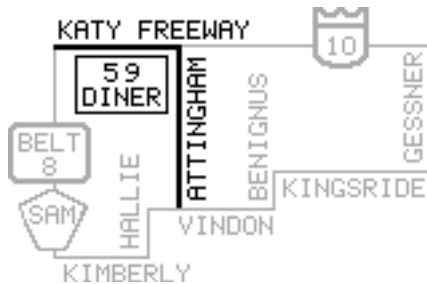

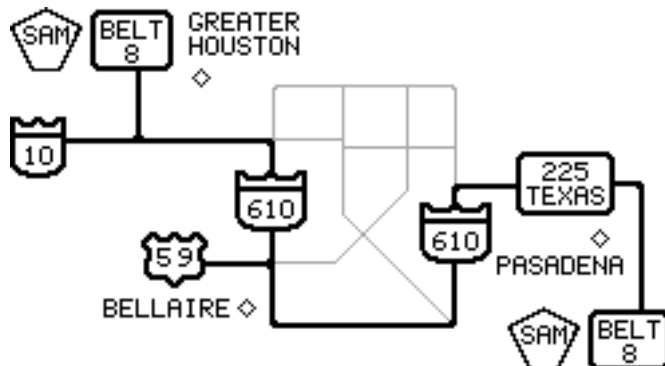
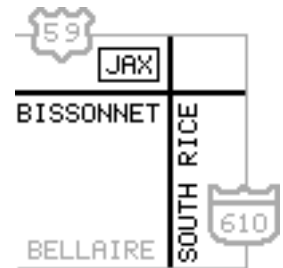
